The Lumberjacks posted a remarkable 28-3 record, a 19-1 conference mark, and pulled off one of college basketball's biggest upsets of all time with a victory

over top-ranked Duke University in Cameron Indoor Stadium. Under the tutelage of Keller, who was named Coach of the Year, senior quard Kevon Harris was unanimously named Southland Conference Player of the Year, joining teammates Gavin Kensmil (Second Team) and John Comeaux (All-Defensive) on the All-**Conference Teams.**

Keller's 88-41(.682) mark in his first four seasons in Nacogdoches includes a pair of 28-win seasons, as well as a Southland Conference Tournament title in 2017-18 and a regular season title and in the shortened 2019-20 season.
